Today, the CHRC is the most influential human rights NGO in central Africa Region.

I worked in Cameroon at human rights Amnesty International as international membership to be represented in internal decision making process (research investigator field). I have a deep interest in Cameroon and continue to monitor with, and investigate human rights on the country. My involvement in human rights research investigator field has been both practical and academic. I have worked in countries in conflict or post conflict phases, including Nigeria, Central Africa Republic etc. I also worked as and investigator Gendarme Major Officer (retired) in Cameroon army, monitor all race elections.
