Independent Expert on human rights and international solidarity	Report presented to the 41st session of the HRC in 2019 on the country visit to Sweden from 23 to 27 April 2018, concluding that the active participation of Malmö and Stockholm in cooperation partnerships to promote SDG 14 contribute to the Swedish effort and commitment to promote a clean and sustainable environment and advocate for its protection and are "clear expressions of

human rights-based international solidarity or of efforts to advance it" (A/HRC/41/44/Add.1).

Report presented to the 69th session of the UNGA in 2014 providing a proposed draft declaration on the right to international solidarity focusing on three areas of concern relevant to the yet to be adopted SDGs, noting that good governance is a precondition preventing and reducing of marine pollution of all kinds as called for by proposed **Target 14.1** (A/69/366).
