Le Secrétaire-générale de l'Organisations des Nations Unies a l'honneur de se référer à l'article 17, para. 6 de la Convention contre la Torture et autres peines ou traitements cruels, inhumains ou dégradants dont le texte est le suivant:

«Si un membre du Comité décède, se démet de ses fonctions ou n'est plus en mesure pour quelque autre raison de s'acquitter de ses attributions au Comité, l'Etat partie qui l'a désigné nomme parmi ses ressortissants un autre expert qui siège au Comité pour la partie du mandat restant à courir, sous réserve de l'approbation de la majorité des Etats parties. Cette approbation est considérée comme acquise à moins que la moitié des Etats parties ou davantage n'émettent une opinion défavorable dans un délai de six semaines à compter du moment où ils ont été informés par le Secrétaire général de l'Organisation des Nations Unies de la nomination proposée».

A cet égard, le Sécrétaire général tient à informer le Gouvernement de Son Excellence que, suite à la démission de M. Jens Modvig, ressortissant danois et membre du Comité contre la torture, le Gouvernement du Danemark a informé le Secrétaire général de sa décision de nommer M. Peter Vedel Kessing pour s'acquitter des tâches confiées au sein du Comité à M. Modvig jusqu'à l'expiration du mandat de ce dernier, le 31 décembre 2021, Merci de trouver en pièce jointe la notice biographique transmise par le Gouvernement du Danemark concernant M. Peter Vedel Kessing. Cette note est disponible en anglais seulement.
