Ms. Al-Jehani participated in drafting many national strategies and plans including Qatar's first national development strategy, 2011-2016 (as chair of drafting committee to the Sectoral Strategy on Family Cohesion and Empowerment of Women). She also participated in the review or drafting of several legislations pertaining to social and women's issues and initiated and oversaw several landmark studies by distinguished scholars on women issues including Violence against Women in Qatari Society, Violence against Married Women - Qatar case study, and Obstacles to Qatari Women Reaching Decision - Making Positions. She organized and supervised numerous workshops, panel discussions and awareness raising campaigns on women issues such as domestic violence, family law, and political rights.
