“Beyond Freedom of Religion or Belief: Guaranteeing the Right of Religious Minorities”

Legal framework and key concepts (Agenda 2)

We welcome the convening of the forum and the topics chosen.

States and religious organizations and other stake holders should take initiatives in the area of awareness rising, promotion of equality of religions and beliefs, and religious tolerance. The Constitution under *Article 25* stated that “All persons are equal before the law and are entitled without any discrimination to the equal protection of the law.
