Leading all the activities of the Serbian Ombudsman related to protection and promotion of human rights and controlling legality and regularity of the work of administrative bodies in the field of the rights of people deprived of liberty and prevention of torture; issuing recommendations to the public stakeholders; regular operating visits to the detention institutions; preparation of reports with recommended measures (more than a hundred reports have been made); maintaining constructive dialogue with the government administration; key person for relations with the international organizations and bodies, foreign national bodies and NGOs in the field of persons deprived of their rights; lecturing at seminars in Scrbia organized for the staff of detention institutions, judges, prosecutors, students, members of NGOs, journalists, etc.; participation as panelist and lecturer in international conferences, roundtables and seminars (Russia, Ukraine, Montenegro).

Other main activities in the field relevant to the mandate of the treaty body concerned:

As the Head of the Directorate for Enforcement of Penal Sanctions in Serbia (2004-2005), I introduced the transparency of prisons, set-up full cooperation with the civil society in controlling prisons and established the system of continuous education of prison staff. I also contributed to the prison reform in Serbia by developing alternative measures and sanctions, as well as the establishment of the Special Prison for the Organized Crime. I was the head of the working group drafting the new Law on Enforcement of Penal Sanctions that harmonizes the rights of prisoners with the international standards and introduces the judiciary control of the work of prison administration. As a member of the Bar Association of Serbia, and the Attorney at Law (1993-2004), I acted as a defense attorney both at the Criminal Court and the Special Court for Organized Crime.
