Welcome to Addis Ababa!

We are pleased to provide you with the following information regarding the practical arrangements for the regional Forum on Business & Human Right.

1. Date and venue

The Regional Forum will take place from 16-18 September 2014 at:

United Nations Conference Center (UNCC), CR2 Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) (Gate 2, pedestrian entrance) Addis Ababa, Ethiopia

2. Registration and identification badges

All participants must register to attend the Regional Forum by completing, signing and returning the registration form to Kongit Girma (kgirma@uneca.org) and Kibrework Ashenafi (kashenafi@uneca.org) or by fax to +251-115-51-6078, **no later than 01 September 2014**.

Participants must obtain a badge prior to entering the UNECA compound.

When you arrive for the Regional Forum, please report to the accreditation office located at Gate 2, pedestrian entrance to the UNECA compound, at 08:30 A.M., bringing your valid passport with you. An identification badge will be issued by presenting your passport.

3. Visas

All participants will require an entry visa; the visa should be obtained from Ethiopian Embassy in your country of residence before departure.

If your country does not have an Ethiopian Embassy, the OHCHR East Africa Regional Office will assist you in obtaining a visa upon arrival at the Addis Ababa airport. Please send scanned copy of **your passport and travel details** by email to kashenafi@uneca.org and kgirma@uneca.org **at least three weeks** before your planned date of departure (i.e. by 25 August 2014). Participants are responsible for the cost of the visa, which is US\$ 20.

4. Flights, accommodation and other costs

Participants are responsible for arranging their own flights and covering the costs of travel, hotel accommodation and other costs associated with participating in the Regional Forum. There is no registration/participation fee.

Lunch will be served for participants on 16 and 17 September 2014.

5. Transport from airport to hotel

7. Health requirements

Visitors to Ethiopia should be in possession of a valid health certificate for yellow fever. Vaccination against cholera is also required for any person who has visited or transited a cholera-infected area within six days prior to arrival in the country.

As Addis Ababa is situated at an altitude of 2,400 meters above sea level, it is advisable to consult your doctor with regard to precautionary measures to avoid some health problems that might occur because of high altitude.

Please note that all participants are responsible for their own medical insurance and are kindly requested to carry the relevant documents on them. Participants that have health issues and take medication are requested to bring their medication with them, as it may not be possible to find it in Addis Ababa.

The United Nations Health Care Centre (UNHCC), situated on the ground floor of the United Nations Conference Center, provides routine medical services on cash basis to participants.

8. Personal security and safety

The United Nations Security and Safety Service is always available to serve all delegates. In this regard, the cooperation of all participants is fully needed to ensure the safety of your valuables and personal security.

Please do the following while you are on ECA premises:

- Display your Identification Badge and wear it visibly, as requested by authorized persons.
- Do not leave bags and parcels unattended, as these will be confiscated or destroyed.
- Do not bring unauthorized persons and children into UNCC.
- Safeguard your valuable property.
- Check for your documents and items before you leave conference halls and meeting rooms.
- If you lose any valuable items within the premises, inform the UN Security and Safety Services or inform the nearest Security Officer.

If you are off the ECA premises and in your hotel:

- Upon entering or leaving your room, kindly systematically lock the door.
- Before leaving, inspect your room to make sure no money, jewellery, cameras, etc., have been left exposed.
- Deposit valuables or portable items at the reception desk and obtain a receipt.

10. Temporary import of equipment

Participants should have no problem bringing one laptop or iPad with them to Ethiopia, but any participants wishing to bring more substantial equipment must declare such equipment in order to comply with the import customs regulation. In order to enable us to assist with the temporary import of such items, please provide a detailed specification of the items you intend to bring, together with your arrival/departure details, by email to kashenafi@uneca.org and kgirma@uneca.org by 25 August 2014. The items will be registered for temporary import by the customs office, and they must be taken out of the country at the end of the Regional Forum.

11. Mobile Phones

Participants are encouraged to bring with them a dual band mobile handset (900/1800 MHZ). Ethiopian Telecommunication Company offers SIM cards with prepaid airtime. The total package, which costs Ethiopian Birr 30, includes Ethiopian Birr 15 airtime.

12. ICT Services

UNCC is equipped with WIFI. Technical support is available through the ECA Help Desk (phone +251-115-443123, email: ihelpdesk@uneca.org). Technical support for presentations must be arranged in advance with the UNCC support team.

Please be advised that Blackberry Services are not available in Ethiopia.

13. Currency

Ethiopian currency is denominated in "Birr" and "centimes". The exchange rate fluctuates. The UN official exchange rate is approximately 1US\$ = 19.56 Birr.

There is a branch of the Commercial Bank of Ethiopia in the UNECA compound – located in the Rotunda. This Bank is open Monday through Friday, from 08:00 to 12:45 and from 2:00 to 4:30 p.m.

Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) services are available at the Commercial Bank of Ethiopia, and at the United Nations Conference Centre (UNCC).

16. General information about Addis Ababa

Language - The official language in Ethiopia is Amharic, but English is widely understood as well.

<u>Local time</u> - Local time in Addis Ababa is Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) plus 3 hours.

<u>Working hours</u> - Office hours for most businesses in Addis are: 08:30-12:30, 13:30-17:30 Monday to Friday. Shops are usually open from 09:00-18:00 Monday to Saturday.

<u>Electric supply</u> - Electric supply in Ethiopia is 220-240 volts, 50 cycles AC accessible via 13-amp, schuko plug.

<u>Getting around</u> - If you would like transportation in Addis Ababa outside of conference time or to take you to the airport at the end of the Conference, you can book a taxi from the National Tourism Organization (NTO) by calling +251-115-51 18 22 or +251-115-51 84 00, or take the yellow or blue taxis parked outside your hotel, but you are advised to negotiate the price for your journey.

17. General information about Ethiopia

Ethiopia is as large as France and Spain combined and has an area of 1,112,000 square metres. Addis Ababa is situated at an altitude of 2,400 metres. Agriculture is the backbone of the national economy, and the principal exports from this sector include coffee, oil seeds, pulses, flowers, vegetables, sugar and animal feed. About 70 per cent of the population earns its living from the land. There is also a vibrant livestock sector, and exports include cattle, hides and skins.

The population of Ethiopia is estimated at 80 million, and over 50 per cent of the population is under 20 years of age. The average number of inhabitants per square kilometre is 69. Ethiopia is a multi-ethnic State with a great variety of spoken languages. There are 83 languages with 200 dialects, and the three main languages are Amharic, Tigrigna and Oromigna. English, French, Italian and Arabic are also spoken, mainly in Addis Ababa. 18. Climate

Ethiopia has two main seasons. The dry season lasts from October through May, and the rainy season starts in late June and ends in September. Temperatures depend on season and altitude. The weather is expected to be slightly cold at night in September/October, so kindly carry a warm jacket/sweater.
