In Switzerland, almost half of assaults committed by men are caused by alcohol, this proportion being of almost a quarter in women (Keller et al. 2007). Similarly; it often plays a role in the damage caused by vandalism. Alcohol is also involved in the so-called youth violence. Of all the violent acts, 25% (individual fights) to 50% (fights between groups) aggression in boys and for girls 30% (individual fights) and 70% (fights between groups) are due to alcohol (Kuntsche et al . 2006). Its disinhibiting power increases under the effect of a group or a crowd, and this is reflected in the level of aggression and violence that occur during major events (eg., Football or hockey matches).

This substance also plays a significant role in domestic violence. In nearly 40% of cases, actors, mostly men, are under the influence of alcohol (Maffli / Zumbrunn 2001).
