

This two story slave quarter and attached kitchen was the dependency behind John W. Waddell's brick Greek Revival home. Waddell was the grandson of William B. Waddell, a member of the Russell, Majors, & Waddell firm, the celebrated pioneers of a Western freight business and the founders of the Pony Express. By 1860, the Waddell family owned some 86 slaves in Lafayette County, Missouri.
