Response of Estonia: Evaluation of the second phase of the World Programme for Human Rights Education

Human rights teaching in higher education

According to the Constitution of the Republic of Estonia, everyone, incl. students, has the right to freely disseminate ideas. According to the § 42 of the Universities Act, students have the right to elect their representatives and to be elected to the collegial decision-making bodies of the university. § 43 of the same law regulates the rights and responsibilities of student bodies and student councils, incl. the right of the students to self-government - to decide on and manage independently, pursuant to law and legislation issued on the basis thereof, issues of student life based on the interests, needs, rights and obligations of students.

Content of the curricula in higher education is up to the higher education institutions and there is no centralized collecting of statistics. It is possible to get information about the courses from the teachers' register of the Estonian Education Information System (EHIS). However, since entering the data into the database is voluntary, the following list below may not be complete:
