



Prof. Verene A. Shepherd

Professor Verene Shepherd is a Social Historian and current Director of the Centre for Reparation Research at The University of the West Indies. She holds the BA and MPhil degrees in History from the University of the West Indies, Mona Campus; and the PhD from the University of Cambridge. She researches Jamaican Economic History, Slavery, Reparation and Gender discourses in Caribbean history.

She is the author of 7 books, including *Livestock, Sugar & Slavery: Contested Terrain in Colonial Jamaica*; *I Want to Disturb My Neighbour: Lectures on Slavery, Emancipation and Post-Colonial Jamaica*; *The Gibson Relays: History & Impact on Jamaica's Sports Culture and Social Development*; *Lucille Mathurin Mair* and *Maharani's Misery: Narratives of a Passage from India to the Caribbean*.

Prof Shepherd is host of "Talking History" on Nationwide 90 FM; a member of the National Council on Reparation (Jamaica), a Vice Chair of the CARICOM Reparation Commission and a Vice-Chair of the UN's Committee for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.

Among her awards are the Order of Distinction, Commander Class, from the Gov't of Jamaica; the Africana Studies distinguished Award from Florida International University and the 2017 UWI Vice Chancellor's award for excellence in Public Service. She was one of the 70+7 women honoured for service to the UWI during The UW's 70th anniversary celebrations as well as one of the 60 Women of Distinction honoured by the Jamaica Gleaner in 2020. She recently won the President's award at the St Martin Book Fair.
