# **CONTEXT AND OUTCOMES**

In his forceful July 2020 statement on "<u>Tackling the Inequality Pandemic: A New Social Contract for a New Era</u>", the UN Secretary General (SG) called for the UN's support to COVID-19 response and recovery to be based on "a New Social Contract and a New Global Deal that create equal opportunities for all and respect the rights and freedoms of all". This will be critical to strengthen social cohesion and rebuild trust as set out in the <u>SG's Common Agenda</u> and in the CEB's <u>UN System Framework for Action on Equality</u>.

This workshop will be an opportunity to **share and learn from experiences at the country level** of how the UN is working to support the COVID-19 response and recovery and operationalizing SG's vision. We will brainstorm on how the recovery can address inequalities, bring transformative, inclusive and sustainable economies, and operationalize a 'new social contract'. We will have space to reflect on challenges and opportunities, analyze gaps, identify pathways for overcoming obstacles, and build synergies between UN entities to strengthen our joint impact – with a **particular focus on how to influence macroeconomic policy** as the UN steps up its role in the economic sphere. This will also be an opportunity to share **strategies**, **guidance and tools that are or can be used by UN entities**, including exploring **how to leverage the UN's normative standards** on human rights, labour and social protection rights, decent work, gender equality and the environment, **in the socio-economic response and recovery to COVID-19**, in line with the <u>SG's Call to Action on Human Rights</u>.

The key outcomes of the meeting will be:

- A workshop report that captures impactful practices of how UN entities are addressing
  inequalities and engaging on macroeconomic policies to operationalize the social contract,
  including by bringing a gender sensitive and human rights-based approach to the macroeconomic
  pillar of the UN's country level work,
- 2. To gather suggestions on how to strengthen collaboration and integration of approaches at the country level
- 3. The establishment of an informal network of economists, policy advisers and gender and human rights specialists interested to keep exchanging practices and work together on macroeconomic policy issues for transformative economic change.

# **Detailed Instructions**

#### Signing In

## In order to join the conference, you will need to first sign into WebEx. To do so:

1. Click on the meeting link. This will direct you to a WebEx browser where you can choose to either enter the meeting through the WebEx app or directly through your web browser.

- a. If you choose to use the WebEx app, you may have to download and install if before you can join the meeting. We recommend testing this at least 10 minutes before the conference begins.
- 2. Enter your name and email.
  - a. Please use the following format: Your NAME (Your Host Organization)
- 3. Once WebEx opens, you will be able to configure your audio and video options before entering the meeting.
  - a. Please follow the instructions below (**Testing your microphone and speaker**) before entering the conference room to avoid technical difficulties.
  - b. Please mute yourself before entering the meeting.
  - c. You can choose to leave your camera off when you enter the meeting room. However, we request that you leave your camera on as much as possible during the meeting out of respect for all participants and speakers.
- 4. Once you have configured your settings, click "Join Meeting".

#### Mute

There are three ways to mute and unmute your microphone:

- 1. "Mute" button: you should see a mute button in the control bar at the bottom of the screen.
- 2. **Top control panel:** In the panel at the top of the screen, under the "**Participants**" tab. The first two options allow you to mute and unmute your microphone.
- 3. **Ctrl + M:** You can use your keyboard to mute/unmute by holding the Ctrl key and pressing M.
- Please leave your microphone muted at all times unless you wish to speak during designated sections of the workshop.

#### Camera

You can turn your camera on and off by clicking the "**Stop video**" button in the control panel at the bottom of the screen.

- If you do not see bottoms at the bottom of the screen, find the arrow in the center and click on it to show control bar.
- Out of respect for the speakers and participants, please leave your camera on during the sessions.

#### <u>Testing your microphone and speaker</u>

When you first sign into WebEx, please begin by testing your microphone and speaker to ensure that they are working properly. Begin by:

- 1. Locate the mute button on the bottom of your screen.
  - a. If you do not see bottoms at the bottom of the screen, find the arrow in the center and click on it to show control bar.
- 2. Open the settings my clicking the arrow next to the word "Mute" and then clicking on Settings.

- a. You can also access the settings menu from the "Audio & Video" button at the top of the screen.
- 3. A box will appear allowing you to choose which speaker and microphone you would prefer to use during the meeting.
- 4. Select your preferred speaker from the dropdown list and then click the "Test" button.
  - a. If you hear the test sound, then you can move on to the next step 5.
  - b. If you do not hear any sound, check your computer to make sure that the volume is turned up.
  - c. If this does not work, then try choosing a new speaker from the dropdown list.
  - d. If you are still having issues, try connecting a pair of headphones.
- 5. Next, select your preferred microphone from the dropdown list and click the "**Test**" button.

#### **WebEx Features**

WebEx has a number of features that may used over the course of the conference.

- **Chat:** The chat icon on the bottom right of the screen will open a box that allow participants to send messages throughout the conference.
  - The dropdown list in the chat box allows you to choose who to send the message to. It can be sent to everyone or else to designated individuals.
  - Participants may use the chat box to ask questions, make comments, or share technical difficulties.
- Participants list: This list displays every participant in the conference.
  - Raise Hand: During open dialogues or Q&A sessions, participants may "raise hand" to signal that they wish to speak. WebEx will automatically sort the order of participants that wish to speak in the participants list.
