- Convene and help facilitate international support to strengthen core public institutions at the national, regional, and local levels.
- Treat the Guiding Principles as an engagement mechanism to encourage and generate learnings, innovation, and technical know-how across a broad spectrum of stakeholders on managing complex business and human rights issues.
- Identify reoccurring human rights issues that businesses encounter, particularly in complex operating environments, and support a dialogue process of practical alternatives.

IPIECA acknowledges the importance of preserving the momentum and consensus that has emerged around the UN Protect, Respect and Remedy Framework in recent years. To this end, we hope that rather than attempting to elaborate precise sector or implementation requirements based on the Guiding Principles, the Working Group will use its mandate to foster a culture of cooperative effort around the implementation of the Framework.

We look forward to exploring opportunities for collaboration with the Working Group as its priorities and plans take shape. We wish the members success in their new roles.
