Child marriage- A child is defines under section 2 of the Child Protection Act as "any unmarried person under the age of 18". Section 20(3) if the Civil Status Act provides that 'where a person has been authorised to many in accordance which Articles 145 to 147 or 154 of the Code Civil Mauricien, a copy of the order authorizing the marriage shall be produced to the officer'. A copy of the Act is enclosed. The age of consent for marriage is at 18 years old by the provisions of Article 144 of the Code Civil. However, a person under the age of 18, <u>but</u> must be over 16 shall be able to contract marriage with his/her parents consent.

**Abortion**- Section 235A makes provision in the Criminal Code and give different instances for the 'authorised termination of pregnancy' provided such pregnancy has not exceeded 14 weeks.
