Since I became a lawyer in 2004, I was the president of the Legal Aid Community Development service when I was doing my National Youth Service Corps and I was able to take up 3 awaiting trial cases in which I concluded one and the inmate was discharged by the High Court. I was able to get a personal experience with the united Nations when I handled Mrs. Sayo Owolabi's case. Unknowingly to me, Mrs. Sayo Owolabi had initially reported a case of domestic violence to the Federation of International Gender and Human Rights organization of the U. N. before contacting me and we were able to work together with the Federation of International Gender and Human Rights of the U. N. and Apena Olabisi Foundation to help Mrs. Owolabi resolve her issues by helping her in getting custody of her children and living in a safe place devoid of fear of violence from her husband.

Working with the Federation of International Gender and Human Rights organization opened my eyes to a wider perspective of the enforcement of human rights and it's redress, especially in my country that doesn't respect court orders, not to talk of rights. I believe I can do more to help people in Nigeria and the region I represent, if I am appointed as a mandate holder. I am ready to devote an aggregate of at least 6 months for this cause and I am prepared to travel outside my country anywhere my help is needed. I love traveling and meeting new people so for me, I can continue to do what I love and also enjoy myself whilst doing it

I Adeyemi Apena (my former surname was Adebanjo), proudly Nigerian is humbly requesting to be appointed as a mandate holder for the Human Rights Council of the United Nations Organization because of the following reasons.

I've always had passion to become a voice for the voiceless, defend the defenceless and hope to the hopeless in the society, which was a strong propelling power for being a lawyer today. I deliberately did not seek a public employment so I can have the time and make free decision in pursuing my passion for human rights. I am not under any allegiance to any public institution or sworn to secrecy on public matters. I started rendering pro Bono services to indigent awaiting trial inmates immediately I became a lawyer and I was able to succeed in getting one Fulani man who had been incarcerated for over 8 years in prison his liberty sometimes in 2005. That is one of the happiest days in my life.

This passion to help the peasants made me give my time (due to lack of funds) to the motherless babies home, Stella Obasanjo babies home, Abeokuta. I unilaterally wrote a letter to the Nigerian Correctional center in Abeokuta to give me inmates who cannot afford legal services and I took some inmates Cases up which made me to meet with the CEO of Prisons Rehabilitation and Law Abiding Organization aka Pralarg who were also doing the same but didn't have a lawyer who could be doing it for there organization. I was able to achieve a lot with this organization, just to name a few, Sunday Ero incarcerated for 7 years got his liberty in 2018, Samuel Amure free legal representation convicted now out since 2021, Sunday Fatusi, free legal services convicted, Michael Olude incarcerated for over 6 years now out since 2021, Olamilekan Balogun incarcerated for over 5 years now out since 2022 etc. Pralarg gave me the right platform to educate people on there rights and tackle erring police officers, magistrates and any corrupt public officer using his position to abuse the rights of peasants. I was also a member of the Justice Sector Reform Team, created by the Ogun State Judiciary. Pralarg had a radio program titled 'Eto mi' in all the southwestern states in Nigeria which I attended occasionally but which has stopped since 2022.

The passion to help others, made me become a founding member and Trustee of Anthonia Toyin Soremekun Foundation ATSF. This organization gave me the platform to help peasants patients who could not afford basic health care and drugs. So I donated my time and money to this organization. I later became the legal adviser to Communities Welfare Association Ogun State and it gave me the correct platform to help the peasants in the community by empowering them financially or giving them the equipment and tools to make a living.

When Pralarg lost focus in 2022, I and some other comrades in Pralarg came together to form Apena Olabisi Foundation (AOF) in 2023 so that we can continue to do legally what we were doing in Pralarg. so I continued to help indigent awaiting trial inmates and give help to widows and peasants. AOF donated books and writing materials to some peasant children in a rural area and I also delivered a public lecture on sexual harassment at Lantoro High school on behalf of AOF in conjunction with the Ogun State Ministry of women affairs and social welfare. AOF has a weekly radio program also titled 'Gbejomiro' on Ogun State Broadcasting corporation 90.5 F. M, every Thursday at 6.30pm to 7pm

If I'm giving the opportunity to be a mandate holder for the Human Rights Council of the U. N., I can help utilize my knowledge to identify the real peasants for the region I represent, give ideas on how to alleviate the suffering of these peasants, ensure the execution of such projects, do other ancillary instructions like giving reports, attending meetings etc and help other mandate holders in the execution of our mandate so that our world can become a better place for every living being on Earth.
