- 1. Regarding the **production of disaggregated data**: generating data is important, but it is not useful if there is no access of the society to this data. Proposal: to promote transparency, the free availability of information to the public so that researchers can carry out research and civil society can organize their demands based on scientific evidence. 2. Recommendation for Governments: Do not use "color rule" to collect data on color/ethnicity/race, but <u>self-definition.</u>It is disrespectful and humilliate Afrodescendents, it is a racist procedure.
- 3. Recommend to governments the generation of data by color-race and not only by country of origin (migration, as in Nordic countries, "new cultural racism", according to Dr. McEachrane), it is essential to make racial inequalities and racism visible. Not all the migrants are equally discriminated against, Africans interviewed believe they are specifically more discriminated against due to their skin-color, the aggressions are referred to by their skin-color.
- s and racism visible. 4. Promote training, sensitization on the deconstruction of structural racism and its role in collecting disaggregated information, training public officials at all levels, so that the information is complete and of quality. Results of policy evaluation show that they are incomplete or collected in a wrong way (not self-identification, but Afrodescendets are identified by the bureaucrats). 5. Promote integrated information systems that allow crossing and correlation of intersectional data to generate scientific evidence.
- 6. **Structural racism and police violence:** not only police, but also vigilantes hired by the private sector to work in supermarkets, shopping centers, transportation systems, banks, they use violence against Afro-descendants. In Brazil there are several cases of kidnapping, assaults and deaths of Afro-descendants inside private sector stores, accused of attempted robbery, who are permanently followed within any business and stores, as part of an institutional policy. Governments must monitor and regulate racist policies implemented by the private sector, in addition to the public sector.
- 7. Declarations and international condemnation of governments and institutions, authorities and public agents who deny or promote racism or who act explicitly in a racist manner. Not only the common citizens can be criminalized by racist acts and speech, but mainly the authorities and officials. 8. Measure setbacks in the anti-racist achievements in the countries. If they stop or not promote the production of data anymore or even racism is explicitly and violently promoted by the state? It is indispensable to have follow-ups and also international positioning about setbacks in the generation of disaggregated information or affirmative policies .
- 9. Campaigns to make internationally visible deaths, murders and attacks against Afrodescendants in various countries, nationals and migrants, by public agents or civil society. Establish in the justice systems hate crimes against Afro-descendants and the corresponding punishments, and ways to enforce the laws. 10. Guarantee land ownership to the remaining Afro-descendant communities of free ex-slaves, projects for the recovery of forms of production and cultural wealth of these communities, with reparations through the promotion of the decisions of these communities, particularly those remnant communities of enslaved Africans who freed themselves, as is the case of the quilombos in Brazil. 11. Promote the political participation of Afro-descendants, in social movements, in political positions in Congress, Senate, judicial, executive and legislative powers 12. Health. COVID: Long-term follow-up and treatment for people with sequelae and

massive vaccination campaigns defending the scientific arguments and results of vaccines. More Afrodescendentes and poor people died for not vaccinating and getting COVID and sequelae..

- 13. To include race/color/ethnicity in the health data system as mandatory, training and convincing health personnel to do it properly
- 14. Including religious support in hospitals, also religions of the African matrix have the right to enter to provide relief to people who ask for that.
