## **Opening of the second session of the Permanent Forum of People of African Descent**

Distinguished Members of the Permanent Forum on People of African Descent, Excellencies, Dear participants,

It is a great honour and a pleasure to address you today, in my capacity as President of the Human Rights Council, at the opening of this second session of the Permanent Forum on People of African Descent.

In March of this year, the Chair of the Inter-governmental Working Group on the Effective Implementation of the Durban Declaration and Programme of Action, in her annual report to the Human Rights Council, provided an update regarding the progress made on the draft United Nations Declaration on the Promotion and Full Respect of the Human Rights of People of African Descent. I am pleased to hear that so many people from around the world are participating in this session. I urge all stakeholders to actively and constructively engage in the discussions that will take place over the next four days, in an atmosphere of sincere respect, in which we all value the expertise and experiences of each other.

I also invite all States to ensure the full and effective implementation of the mandate of the Permanent Forum. It is through this proactive involvement with HRC mechanisms that we can achieve the full inclusion of people of African descent in the societies in which they live as equal citizens without discrimination of any kind, and through which we can contribute to ensuring their equal enjoyment of all human rights, as envisaged in the mandate of the Permanent Forum.

I wish you an engaging and impactful session.
