Thank you, Moderator.

The delegation of Trinidad and Tobago thanks the panellists for their insightful perspectives on how

the rich and diverse cultures of People of African Descent can be increasingly recognised, promoted

and protected.

In reflecting on the last decade, and as highlighted by some speakers over the past few days, there has

been increasing recognition of the influence and impact of our varied cultures on the global landscape.

One such example relates to the national instrument of Trinidad and Tobago – the steelpan. As the

birthplace of the steelpan, which is the foremost acoustic instrument invented in the 20th century, we

wish to highlight the adoption, in July 2023, of UN General Assembly resolution 77/316 entitled

World Steelpan Day, which resulted in the proclamation of August 11 as World Steelpan Day, to be

observed annually.

We also recognise the important contribution of pertinent ongoing work in other multilateral spaces,

such as work in the context of UNESCO on cultural heritage, including intangible cultural heritage.

We also take this opportunity to point to the imperative for meaningful engagement in negotiations

within the context of the WIPO Intergovernmental Committee on Intellectual Property and Genetic

Resources, Traditional Knowledge and Folklore, as a means of securing due recognition and

protection with respect to the traditional knowledge and traditional cultural expressions of People of

African Descent across the globe. On this note, we wish to highlight our valuable partnership with

WIPO on Trinidad and Tobago Carnival and works of mas, including with respect to an IP

management strategy for the IP assets of Trinidad and Tobago's Carnival Museum.
