









Growing up on the streets and realizing children's rights:

Promising practices addressing violence against all children

SATELLITE EVENT PRIOR TO THE 1ST GLOBAL MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE ON ENDING **VIOLENCE AGAINST CHILDREN**





Violence affects half of the world's children, including those living on the streets in every country, for whom violence is a daily reality. Street-connected children often don't have the same chances and **protection** as other children, yet many government programs don't focus on them and the special problems they deal with. Studies show that the more inequalities there are, the more these children face danger and struggles.



This event is a chance for us to **make big changes** by working together and making sure streetconnected children are safe and protected, leaving no child behind.

Recognising that children are experts in their own **lives** and have the right to be heard, we will look at solutions to ensure that their rights are included in policy plans to stop and prevent violence against all children.



Children's rights are protected under the Convention on the Rights of the Child, an agreement that many countries have

A General Comment is a guide made by experts to help governments understand how to follow the rules in the Convention and better protect children's rights.

In 2017, the Committee on the Rights of the Child wrote General Comment 21 (2017) on Children in Street Situations, specifically.
