TUIC's Contribution to the Human Rights 75 Youth Declaration

- 1. Today's global challenges climate change, migration, gender inequality, and a lack of quality education pose serious threats to the future of human rights. Climate change exacerbates socioeconomic disparities and causes forced migrations, leading to a significant increase in human rights abuses. Persistent gender inequality affects the rights of women and girls worldwide, while a lack of quality education inhibits social mobility, reinforcing existing disparities. As International Relations Studies Association TUIC, we aspire to a future where human rights are safeguarded universally, where climate justice is realized, migration is secure and dignified, quality education is accessible to all, and gender equality is the norm.
- 2. For the betterment of human rights, TUIC makes the following recommendations:
 - Recognize climate change as a human rights issue, and implement robust policies for climate justice.
 - Address forced migration at its roots, create safe pathways, and respect migrants' rights.
 - Prioritize gender equality in all policies, fight gender-based violence, and include all genders in decision-making.
 - Ensure access to quality education for all, especially marginalized communities, and incorporate human rights education in curricula.

We urge the OHCHR, United Nations, and other international organizations to hold governments accountable for human rights violations and promote a global culture that respects and upholds human rights.

- 3. As young people leading the charge, we believe the following actions can advance human rights:
 - Advocate for climate justice, hold governments accountable for climate commitments and promote sustainable lifestyles.
 - Support organizations that work for migrants' rights and leverage digital platforms to fight xenophobia and misconceptions.
 - Uphold gender equality, support women's and LGBTQ+ rights, and stand against gender-based violence.
 - Support initiatives that promote quality education and lobby for inclusive educational policies.

Youth have a unique role in driving discourse and action around human rights. We believe that our collective efforts can lead to meaningful change, and we are committed to working tirelessly to achieve our vision of a world where human rights are universally respected and protected. As TUIC, we will contribute to the Human Rights 75 Youth Declaration with the insights and experiences of our vibrant, diverse, and engaged youth, aiming to shape a future where human rights are at the heart of all policies and actions.
