3. Access to Information and Communication Technologies

Currently in Fiji people with disabilities, particularly people who have hearing or visual impairment or who are deaf or blind can not access the information they need to and they can not always impart information easily to other People who are deaf can not

hear important information such as national news weather reports as there are no captions or interpreters on these programmes. People who are blind are unable to

read important public information as it is only available on print which they are unable to read. Although these rights are guaranteed in,
