



**Pledge submitted by Luxembourg and Mexico to the Human Rights 75 Secretariat
December 2023**

Original language of submission: English

Type of pledge: Collective

Pledging entity: Luxembourg and Mexico

Co-pledgers: 59 Member States*

In the next five years, this cross-regional pledge from 59 Member States commits to advancing the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in four ways:

- 1) Continuing to uphold the universality, indivisibility, interdependence, and interrelatedness of all human rights and fundamental freedoms, treating them in a fair and equal manner.
- 2) Ensuring that progressivity and non-regression remain a fundamental part of achieving all human rights enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
- 3) Striving to end multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination, coercion, violence, and the denial of the full realization of human rights for all individuals by advancing human rights standards.
- 4) Defending and advancing human rights processes and international and regional instruments including, the ICPD Programme of Action and Beijing Platform for Action and their review conferences; particularly in the face of the pushback on gender equality and sexual and reproductive health and rights, and efforts to instrumentalize these mechanisms through a narrow and restrictive lens.
